When grading according to the 7-point scale, the student's performance should be assessed in relation to the learning outcomes and competences.

Failed exam

If the student is graded with either "00" or "-3", the student fails the exam.

Mandatory activities

A student with non-approved mandatory activities is graded "NA" (=not approved) on the examination record. All mandatory activities must be approved before the student can participate in the re-exam.

No submission

If no exam paper has been submitted, you register a "U" (Udeblevet = absent) on the examination record.

Group submissions (CG1 and C2G) without individualization

For C1G and C2G exams, students must clearly identify which respective parts of the submitted work they are responsible for to be able to establish a solid foundation for individual grading. If not, all students in the group must be graded with a "-3".

Bachelor and final projects, thesis without abstract

The thesis or project must include an abstract in a foreign language. If not, the project or thesis must be graded with a "-3".

Submission with following oral exam (D- and E-exams)

The student may choose to **submit** the exam paper, but **not show up** at the oral exam. The student must be graded with a **"-3"** since the student cannot pass the overall exam without being present at the oral exam.

Illness

If the absence or lack of submission is caused by illness, the student must be graded with a "U" (Udeblevet = absent).

If the student hands in a doctor note to Student Affairs and Programmes no later than 8 working days after the exam day, the exam attempt will be cancelled.

Plagiarism/Exam fraud

If you suspect plagiarism or exam fraud, you must notify the exam coordinator immediately, but not contact the student. Student Affairs and Programmes will handle the case. The student must be graded a "-3.".
