As part of the analysis it will be considered whether it could be an advantage for students and employees, as well as an efficiency improvement, to establish a joint desk ("one stop shop"), manned by employees from departments with service tasks (i.e. primarily FM, IT and the Study Administration). The analysis will also include a potential takeover of the 5th floor, and cover areas such as: How much of the floor should be taken over? How should the rooms be used? How should the rooms be furnished?	Analysis of the office facilities has ended and the final report has been produced. The description of ideas for the One-stop-shop has been presented, but due to dismissal from partners, the project will not be implemented. The scenario of the takeover of the 5th floor has been made, though the arrangement of the office facilities awaits the decision of facility allocation.
