S2	At least 18 PhD students will graduate during 2013.	The number of PhD´s graduated in 2013 is 22.	
S3	The IT University will insource EBUSS (cand.it. E-business or DIM) from the fall of 2013.	The curriculum was approved by the Vice Chancellor on 10 July 2013. Also, names of teachers were registered in the course database by 15 August 2013. However, just 68 students were admitted by 1 September 2013 where else the number should have been 85. In 2013, nine partly manual workflows were digitized by launching the personnel management system, ScanPas: 1) 'Stamdatabasen'; 2) 'Omsorgsark'; 3) 'Ferieark/omsorgsdage'; 4) 'Barselsoversigt'; 5) 'Personfortegnelsen' (partly because ScanPas will feed 'Personfortegnelsen' with data); 6) 'Langtidssygdom'; 7) 'Mobiltelefonlisten'; 8) 'De kom – de gik'; and 9) 'Gæster på ITU'. Moreover, the manually booking of meeting rooms (by telephone booking and paper calendars) has been digitized so that ITU employees can book meeting rooms in Outlook.
