For example, digital registration of research applications and projects, absence sheets, "datablanketter" etc. In addition the effects of at least three recently implemented projects will be measured.	ScanPas and LearnIT have been evaluated. The evaluation shows, that 3 work flows have been improved through digitalization. One project remains to be evaluated.

The teacher is still remote.
